The Board continues attempting to address decorations that are not allowed on and around gravesites. The cemetery has rules which set forth what can and cannot be placed on or around a gravesite. These have been adopted to help minimize the amount of impact on the landscaping company as they do their work to keep the cemetery looking its best when they mow. They also allow the digging required for adjacent burials. Please help us by observing these rules.

# **Happenings at Lee Mission Cemetery**

The Cemetery Board is happy to share with you the progress we are making in maintaining the Lee Mission Cemetery as an important historic site and place of respite for the Salem community.

In preparation for Memorial Day, we had a work day that was well attended by members of the LDS, Salem 1st Ward, Church. Much work was done to beautify the grave sites and prepare the cemetery for the holiday. Thank you to all those who volunteered! We will have another service day on September 9 (see Cemetery Cleanup article on page 4).

The Board also decorated the cemetery for Memorial Day by putting out 97 clergy flags and 173 veteran flags to honor those who have served.

The Board is in the process of repairing grave stones that have broken or fallen over. We have initially identified 25 grave stones for repair and received a bid from Historic Preservation Northwest for



\$7,000. To partially fund this work, we will seek a grant from the Oregon Commission on Historic Cemeteries. Since this grant will only cover part of the expense, we will need to provide in-kind work and other monetary donations to match the amount received. Please consider donating toward this important project.

The markers which identify the different sections of the cemetery were repaired and replaced as necessary. New caps were put on the posts so they will last longer.

The Board is also working on finding a contractor who can repair and replace the historic fencing around Diamond Square. Our goal is to repair the pieces of the fence that are still usable and have the missing parts fabricated to match the original

fence, so that we can reinstall the entire fence around the square. Unfortunately, there are not many companies that do this type of work. Once we find such a company and get an estimate, we will submit an application to the City of Salem for approval of the project and a grant request for funding. This has been a long-term goal of the Board and we hope to see progress on it in the next year. Again, if you would like to make a donation toward the fence repair, let us know!

Finally, to maintain the financial stability of the cemetery, the Board voted to raise the cost of cemetery plots to \$1,500 beginning August 1, 2023. This allows for one coffin and one urn OR for two urns in the plot. Plots initially purchased as a single burial site incur a fee of \$400 to add an urn to the gravesite.

# Cemetery Cleanup Saturday, September 9

In keeping with the National Day of Service on September 11, Lee Mission Cemetery will be having a cleanup day on Saturday, September 9 from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.

Please bring gloves, lawn tools such as rakes, clippers, etc., and wheel barrows if you have one. Light refreshments will be provided.

As part of the cleanup, we will remove items from around the individual gravesites that do not comply with the cemetery rules. This is necessary for us to maintain the cemetery and have access for new burials. The rules provide:

"Lee Mission Cemetery is not responsible for any damage or missing items to headstones or items placed on graves.

- A. Artificial flowers are not allowed April thru September. Fresh flowers are allowed year round.
- B. The following items are prohibited:
  - breakables including glass or ceramic vases and candles,
  - rocks, tiles, and marbles,
  - fencing or other structures.
- C. No plants, flowers, or decorations may be placed more than 12 inches away from headstone.

D. Trees, shrubs, or flowers may not be planted on the plot.

The cemetery board maintains the right to remove any article, keepsake or planting which is not consistent with the historical, natural and maintenance needs of the cemetery."

Each owner of a gravesite was provided these rules and regulations when they received the gravesite deed. Notices will be put on the graves in July and August to remind people visiting the cemetery to remove items they do not want discarded.

We welcome all and appreciate everyone's help in this effort to provide a peaceful place of rest for our beloved who are buried at Lee Mission.
